- Building literary and language skills

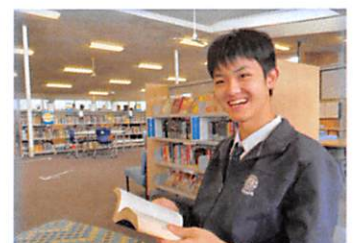

- A history of outstanding HSC results across the range of subjects offered

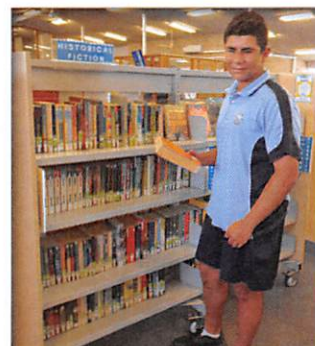

The Creative Arts faculty includes Visual Art and Music. We offer students the opportunity to explore creative expression through the development of their individual talents as well as learning practical and problem solving skills.

The facilities at Blakehurst High School include sophisticated digital photographic equipment and a darkroom, for exploration of wet photography. Additionally, students develop their skills in design through the medium of clay.

Our staff are specialists in their teaching area with a commitment to excellence in the areas of Visual Arts, Design & Photography.

Music:

- In Music students learn through listening, performance and composition. They study a range of music styles including those that are technology based. Students are actively encouraged to be part of the school band or to develop skills in a particular instrument. Students may receive tuition in guitar and choir.
- Facilities include two well equipped classrooms, a rehearsal room and access to a variety of composition software.

Photographic & Digital Media:

- This course encompasses both wet photography practice and Digital Media areas which include tuition in Photoshop, Flash Animation and Film Making.

Visual Arts:

- This course covers the traditional areas of drawing, painting, printmaking and sculpture. Students also investigate contemporary practice in the area of digital media.

Visual Design:

- Visual Design has an emphasis on design practice. This course investigates the way design impacts on our world and can include Graphic Design, Costume Design, Architectural design, Environmental Design as well as the Designed Objects.

We aim to develop our student's:

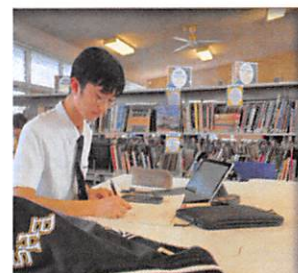

Student Leadership

Student leaders at Blakehurst High School have an important leadership role in the school and enhancing the community's respect for the school. Student leaders are expected to display behaviour of the highset standard at all times, show leadership in the playground and beyond the school gates, and encourage responsible behaviour in other students. School leaders fulfil a number of roles at official functions and representing the school.

Senior Prefects

Each year up to 24 senior students are selected to be prefects. The selection process is based on written applications followed by an interview. The selection criteria includes evidence of an extensive involvement in school life such as Interact, SRC, Peer Support, school sport, debating, fund raising, environmental team and peer tutoring. Students must have a very good attendance record and be held in high regard by the school community. Selected Prefects participate in an overnight camp at Stanwell Tops Conference Centre. Through a series of bonding activities and leadership training seminars delivered by Burn Bright this camp enhances their ability to work effectively together as a group and carry out their duties and responsibilities.

Senior Prefects have duties throughout the year. These include:

- Being involved in sub-committees according to their selected projects for that year
- Attending and assisting in school activities and functions such as subject selection evenings, open night, music night
- Chairing and assisting at assemblies
- Playground duties
- Fund raising
- Being an ambassador for the school representing it at events outside school
- Supporting younger students and being prepared to spend time with the students and give guidance and advice

The Senior Prefects abide not only by the school's values of integrity, rigour and empathy but also by the pledge they undertake where they promise to do their best to be a positive role model for other students as well as proactively maintaining the school reputation to assist with the efficient operation of the school wherever possible.

They maintain they will "at all times and in all places maintain the honour of my school, for what I am, my school will be".

Junior Prefects

Each year up to 20 Year 9 students are selected to be junior prefects. The selection process is based on written applications followed by an interview. In order to be selected students must have a very good attendance record and be held in high regard by the school community. Students must have demonstrated the potential and the desire to develop leadership qualities and have a commitment to contributing positively to the school community.

Selected Prefects participate in a one-day training programme facilitated by Burn Bright a student leadership programme that enhances their ability to work effectively together as a group and carry out their duties and responsibilities.

Junior Prefects have duties throughout the year. These may include:

- Chairing and assisting at assemblies
- Fund raising e.g. Genes for Jeans, Day, Daffodil Day Crazy hair day- Leukaemia Foundation, Cake Stalls for various charities.
- This year they have one major project The Bushfire Appeal
- Showing parents and visitors around the school
- Community Service e.g. local nursing home visits
- Assist teachers when asked

Peer Support Leaders

- Peer Support Leaders are Year 10 students who assist new Year 7 students in the transition from Year 6 to Year 7. This programme operates in Term 1 and Term 2 each year. The programme places trained Year 10 students in contact with a small group of Year 7 students for a variety of activities which help Year 7 students develop familiarity with the school, develop their social skills and make valuable links with older students.
- Each year all Year 9 students undergo an intensive three day peer support leadership training programme. Nominations are made by staff group facilitators on the basis of the students' skills and interaction throughout the three day programme. Nominations are reviewed by the Year Advisers who make the final selections. Selected students have a further one day training programme to familiarise themselves with the delivery of the course and to further develop their leadership skills.



INTERACT

Interact is a student group focused on the local, national and global community through action. Students are encouraged to focus on an issue to increase awareness, contribute to or assist. Examples of past projects have been Knit With Love, clothing collection for Youth Refuges, canned food drives and stationery drives.

SRC

The Student Representative Council (SRC) is a student-led group consisting of students from Years 7-11. These students represent the opinions, interests and needs of all students from across the school.

We complete two major projects each year with the aim of improving the school and the relationship we have with other organisations in our community. To fund for these major projects, the SRC runs various events and fundraisers throughout the year. In the past, SRC has raised money for new bike racks and bins, painted murals (unfortunately the painters accidentally painted over these over the break but we are keen to inject some passion back on to our school walls in 2020). Supporting Bear Cottage with much needed gifts was a key achievement in 2020.

Environmental Team

The student led environmental team raise awareness with regards to the environment. They support Georges River Council Initiatives and work within the Kogarah Cluster of schools to support green initiatives. The team often give presentations and ensure the up-keep of our schools gardens and vegetable patch.



PALS Team

The primary role of this group of students is to support students who transition to BHS from primary school. Their role is to be a big brother or sister to our newcomers.

SALSA Team

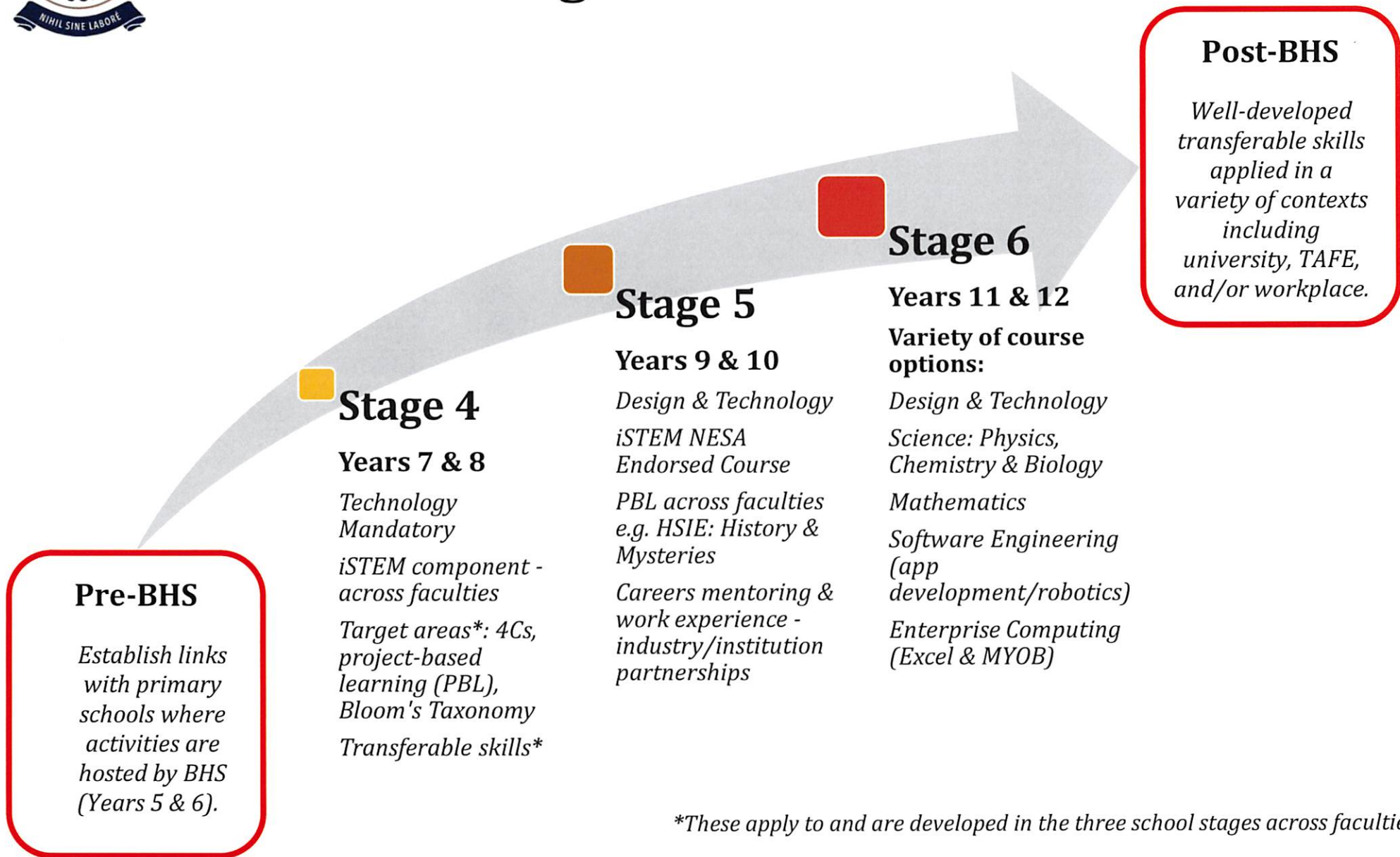

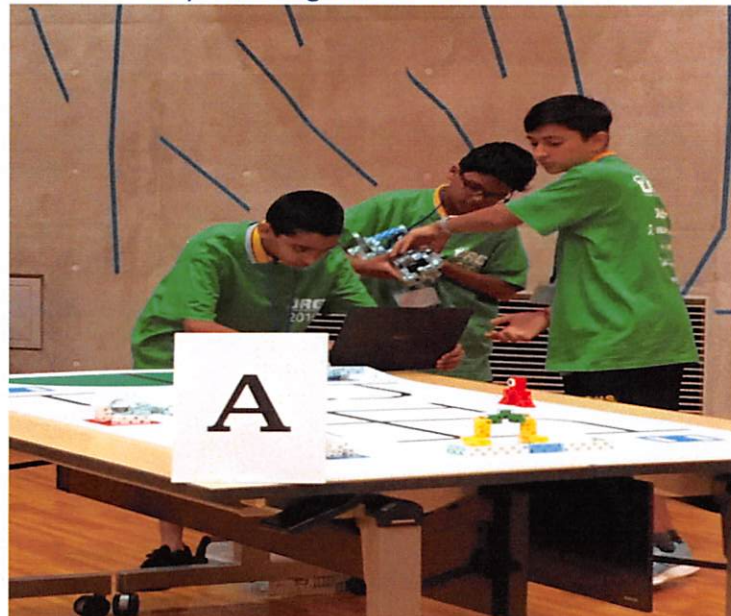


TECH CLUB

Tech club is place for technology minded students to get together to explore the world of PC's, Robotics, Programming and Gaming. The team also looks for challenges like the EV3 Mindstorm robotics challenge or the Hunter Valley Electric festival to compete against other schools.

In 2019 we had 4 teams of year 7 students participate in the Universal Robotics Challenge. The competition was held by EduTech Australia in partnership with UTS. Two teams were sponsored by EduTech Australia and the school subsidised the other two teams. The URC was an opportunity to foster STEM thinking and close the gap in terms of lower SES students and females student's being exposed to and actively involved in such experiences. Having an all female team participate was especially fulfilling. Their hard work paid off. The advanced team took out the competition and represented Australia in Japan. We sent 10 students to Japan as we wanted to support, acknowledge and inspire as many of the participants as we could. The school is in the process of transitioning to a STEM curriculum. The URC has provided impetus across the school and has highlighted what our students are capable of once they are given and once they themselves take up opportunities.

All students are welcome to join to make new friends as they work together to learn about the world of technology.
